Where is my student going?

Graduation requirements and the a-g
College Pathway

Grades and Credit:

- “A, B, C, D” grades = 5 credits

- “D” grades give high school graduation credit only, are not given extra GPA points in honors/AP courses, and do not count for college admission.

- “F” grades = 0 credits

- If you fail a required graduation course you MUST make it up in summer school or the next year.

***Students are responsible for registering for their own
summer school classes!***

The “A -G”/Graduation Requirements

A-G

- 4 yrs English
- 2 yrs History/Social Science (World/US)
- 3 yrs Math (*4 yrs strongly recommended*)
 - Integrated Math I, II, **III**
- 2 yrs Lab Science (*3 yrs strongly recommended*)
 - Minimum of Biology and Chemistry or Physics
- 2 yrs same **World Language** (*3 yrs recommended*)
- 1 yr Visual/Performing Art
- 1 yr **College Prep Elective**

High School Graduation

- 4 yrs English
- 3 yrs History/Social Science
(World 10th/US 11th/Econ-Gov 12th)
- 2 yrs Math
 - Minimum of Integrated Math I & II
- 2 yrs of Science (Biological/Physical)
- 1 yr of Visual/Performing Arts
- 1 semester Health
- 2 yrs Physical Education
- 1 semester Career Prep
- General electives = 70 credits
Total = 220 credits

Note: All students are expected to be enrolled in science 9th, 10th, and 11th grade, and in math 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grade. (Excluding summer school)

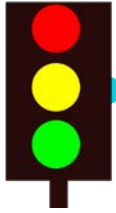
How do I help my student get there?

Habits that help

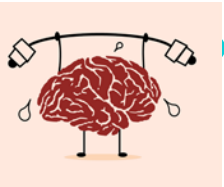
Executive Functioning Skills



Impulse Control-the ability to stop and think before acting



Emotional Control-the ability to manage feelings by thinking about goals



Working Memory- the ability to hold information in mind and use it to complete a task.



Executive Functioning Skills



Planning/Prioritizing-The ability to create steps to reach a goal and to make decisions about what to focus on.



Self-Motivation-The ability to monitor and evaluate your own performance



Flexibility- The ability to change strategies or revise plans when conditions change.



Habits that help

- Come to school every day
- Be on time to class every period, every day
- Encourage student to use their planner (or Google calendar) to backward plan
- Ask student where/when do they plan to study (which room in the house)
- Encourage student to talk/email to their teacher and then follow up with the student
- Reading 30 minutes/night

User Protocol for Secondary Students:

Username:

First initial of first name + first 3 letters of last name + last 4 digits of Local ID# + @stu.gusd.net

Example: m+mou+3456+@stu.gusd.net or mmou3456@stu.gusd.net

Password:

gusd + Stu ID# + ! (exclamation point at the end)

Example: gusd123456! (Their GUSD student ID #)

Secondary Students will be forced to change password upon first log in



What resources/academic help are available to parents and students?



Parent and Student Portal

- Parent.gusd.net: update your emergency information, sign off on some district forms, check attendance, and see current grades.
- Student.gusd.net: provides grade/attendance information for students.
- GUSD is no longer mailing home 5, 10, 15 week progress reports; all information can be found on the parent/student portals.



Student Enrichment Centers

- Credentialed teachers in each of the core content areas assist in English, Math, Science, Social Studies and World Languages
