Promotion Requirements

2018-2019

Beginning in 7th grade, middle school students are on a credit system to determine eligibility for promotion to high school. Grades of F do not earn credits. Students earn 5 credits for each successfully completed class. They have the opportunity to earn a minimum of 30 credits during each semester period. Students may also earn 5 credits for each successfully completed zero period. All 4 semester report cards, intervention classes, and summer school are used to calculate credit totals.

Please carefully read the updated Toll Middle School Promotional requirements listed below:

Credits are based on 7th and 8th grade semester report card grades.

GOLD LEVEL

- 120 credits in 7th and 8th grades
- 3.8 or higher cumulative GPA by the second semester of 7th grade
- 20 hours of community service in 8th grade
- One-time participation in a Toll Middle School approved activity
- No U, N, or F grades on semester report cards
- Successful completion of an 8th grade project
- No suspensions in 8th grade

GREEN LEVEL

- 120 credits in 7th and 8th grades
- 3.5 cumulative GPA by the second semester of 7th grade
- 10 hours of community service in 8th grade
- One-time participation in a Toll Middle School approved activity
- No U or F grades on semester report cards
- No more than one (1) N in all four semesters
- No more than one (1) suspension in 8th grade

WHITE LEVEL

- 100 credits in 7th and 8th grade
- No more than two (2) failing grades (Fs) on the second semester report card of the 8th grade year
- No more than four (4) unsatisfactory marks (Us) in 8th grade
- No more than two (2) Us earned during the second semester of 8th grade
- No more than two (2) suspensions in 8th grade, with no more than one (1) suspension during the second semester

Students needing additional credits for promotion will be given opportunities through our intervention classes.

It is our goal that every student participates in all culminating promotional activities, promotes from middle school, and is prepared to meet the needs of the new rigorous Common Core State Standards for high school.
