- Review Fitness Test results, California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS) results and GUSD student results
- Review threat assessments and services provided

Fitness Test Given Spring 2017

(iPads used to record data)

Indicators/Metrics for Priority 3

- Increase the students scoring in the “healthy fitness zone” (5/6 on fitness test) by 2%
- **Healthy Fitness Zone (2015)**
 - 5th: 69.6%
 - 7th: 61.9%
 - 9th: 69.6%

**CHKS Given
October/November 2016**

Indicators/Metrics for Priority 3

- Increase percent of students scoring “high level” on CHKS by 3%
 - **Social Connectedness** (2014)
 - 5th: 68%; 7th: 67%; 9th: 51%; 11th: 43%; NT: n/a
 - **Positive relationships with caring adults** (2014)
 - 5th: 61%; 7th: 42%; 9th: 32%; 11th: 33%; NT: n/a

Indicators/Metrics for Priority 3

- Decrease percent of students marking “yes” on CHKS by 3%
 - **Feeling sad and hopeless** (2014)
 - 5th: n/a; 7th: 21%; 9th: 25%; 11th: 28%; NT: n/a
 - **Considered attempting suicide** (2014)
 - 5th: n/a; 7th: n/a; 9th: 15%; 11th: 15%; NT: n/a

**GUSD Student Survey Given
January/February 2017**

Indicators/Metrics for Priority 3

- Increase GUSD student survey results by 1% to 3% (4th - 12th grade students)
 - **Academic Results (2015)**
 - 96% plan to go to college
 - 32% feel academically challenged

Indicators/Metrics for Priority 3

- Increase GUSD student survey results by 1% to 3% (4th-12th grade students)
 - **Support and School Culture Results (2015)**
 - 81% feel staff members **care** about students
 - 66.3% feel staff members **listen** to students
 - 63.4% feel treated **fairly** by staff
 - 60.3% **trust** an adult on campus to talk to
 - 8.9% felt feelings of sadness or hopelessness and wanted to hurt themselves or others

Threat Assessments

Indicators/Metrics for Priority 3

- Decrease number of threat assessments by 5%
 - **Threat Assessments (2015)**
 - 100 total
 - Elementary: 6
 - Middle: 35
 - High: 58
 - FACTS: 1
 - » Hospitalized: 35
 - » Not hospitalized: 62
 - » Unknown: 3
 - » General education students: 67
 - » Special education students: 33

Current Threat Assessments for 2016-2017

- **Threat Assessments** (as of November 2016)
 - 30 total
 - Elementary: 3
 - Middle: 16
 - High: 11
 - FACTS: 0
 - Hospitalized: 8
 - Not hospitalized: 22
 - Unknown: 0
 - » General education students: 23
 - » Special education students: 7

Drop Outs Rates

Cohort Graduation Rate

Indicators/Metrics for Priority 3

- Decrease drop out rates (MS .05%; HS .025%) and increase graduation cohort rate (0.5%)
 - **Middle School Drop Out Rate (2015)**
 - .09% (4 students)
 - **High School Drop Out Rate (2015)**
 - 0.5% (42 students)
 - **Graduation Cohort Rate (2015)**
 - 91.5%

What are we doing now to support students?

- Counselors at middle and high schools
- Psychologist at all levels
- Nurses, LVN's, health assistants at sites
- Provide PE teachers 4-12
- Healthy Start counseling support
- Special Education counseling support
- Credit recovery programs
- Early interventions (academic, social/emotional)

What are we doing differently than we did before?

- Increased partnerships with local colleges to provide intern mental health providers
 - 15 interns (first year)
 - Elementary schools (2): Edison, Keppel
 - Middle schools (6): Toll, Wilson
 - High schools (7): CV, Glendale, Hoover
 - 1 intern (second year)
 - Healthy Start

What are we doing differently than we did before?

- Increased partnerships
 - Didi Hirsch
 - Pacific Clinics
- Parenting classes
- Pilot at Toll (Wellness Center) to support students and parents at all three schools
- Promoting a culture of CARE, TRUST, and INQUIRY

Healthy Start Counseling

(as of November 2016)

- Total Mental Health Referrals: 107
 - Healthy Start Counselors: 25
 - Wellness Center at Toll: 13
 - Didi Hirsch: 31
 - Pacific Clinics: 38
- Foster Youth Served: 95
- Homeless Youth Served: 68
- Parenting class participants a Edison: 43

Special Education Counseling

(as of November 2016)

- Total GUSD: 302
 - Secondary: 201 (last year 132)
 - Elementary: 78 (last year 65)
 - Parent counseling: 23
- Other settings: 91
 - Mag Park: 8
 - GHS South: 6
 - Jewel City: 4
 - NPS: 70
 - FACTS: 3
