GUSD Named to Educational Results Partnership Honor Roll

GLENDALE, CA – Glendale Unified School District and 15 GUSD schools have been named to the 2018-19 Educational Results Partnership Honor Roll for high achievement and student success. The Honor Roll program, sponsored by the Campaign for Business and Education Excellence, is part of a national effort to identify high performing schools and districts that are improving student outcomes.

This is the fourth year ERP has recognized Honor Roll School Districts. GUSD is one of only eight public school districts in California to receive this honor all four consecutive years. Additionally, 12 GUSD schools have been named 2018-19 “Star Schools,” high performing schools serving higher poverty communities: Clark Magnet HS, Glendale HS, Hoover HS, Roosevelt MS, Toll MS, Wilson MS, Balboa ES, Jefferson ES, Keppel ES, Mann ES, Muir ES, and R.D. White ES. Three more GUSD schools have been recognized as “Scholar Schools,” high performing schools without significant levels of low-income students: Crescenta Valley HS, La Crescenta ES, and Monte Vista ES.

The 2018-19 Honor Roll is developed by Educational Results Partnership (ERP), a nonprofit organization that applies data science to help improve student outcomes and college and career readiness. ERP maintains the nation’s largest database on student achievement and utilizes this data to identify higher-performing schools and districts. School districts that receive the ERP Honor Roll distinction have demonstrated consistent high levels of student academic achievement and college readiness, improvement in achievement levels over time, and a reduction in achievement gaps among student populations.

“We are proud that our district and schools are being recognized once again by educational and business leaders in California,” said GUSD Interim Superintendent Dr. Kelly King. “Our teachers, administrators, and classified staff continuously strive to maximize academic achievement and prepare every student for future success. We are pleased to see our hard work and dedication produce such positive results.”
