The GUSD Career & Technical Education department is excited to offer two new programs for GHS students in health science nursing and information technology for 2019-2020 school year.

In the LA region, careers in health science are in high-demand and this program will prepare GHS students for nursing and medical assisting. Health science is great career path - the number of health

science jobs is growing much faster than average, and the field is adding more total jobs than any other category. With courses available to GHS students, they can graduate from high school with the skills and certification required to land a high-paying job.

Information technology is the fastest growing career category, and jobs in the IT field pay more than double the national average - the current median pay for IT workers is \$81,430 per year. With courses available to high school students, they can graduate from high school with the skills and credentials to start pursuing a high-paying career.

The programs will be offered after-school to allow students more flexibility to complete the program without affecting the course load that students are required to complete for graduation and A-G eligibility. If your student is interested, please sign-up in the counseling office.

WHAT ARE RESTORATIVE PRACTICES? Restorative Practice is a framework for building community and for responding to challenging behavior through authentic dialogue, coming to understanding, and making things right. Restorative Practice support healthy relationships among all stakeholders to help our staff and students meet with daily success in their efforts to learn and grow personally, socially, and academically.

GENERAL:

All Students need to bring their ID Cards to the Student Store when making any kind of payments or donations. Students needing to pick up their textbook, please do so during SNACK AND LUNCH. PROCEDURES FOR WORK PERMITS: Please follow the Steps below:

Visit the GHS Website: <https://www.gusd.net/domain/2261>

Click on Work Permit to print out the application. Make sure to fill it out completely and PRINT clearly. Remember your Social Security.

Take the completed application to room 4112 to your Counselor. They will check your grades, Grad Status, credits, behavior, and attendance. And then give final approval.

Once approved, take your application to room 4113 during SNACK or LUNCH TIME ONLY.

Office will inform you on when you may pick up your WORK PERMIT.

If you are unable to print the application from home you can pick one up in room 1110, in the Main Office during SNACK OR LUNCH.

Office Campus Lunch

Go to Glendale High website and printout the Parent Permission Form for Off-Campus Lunch.

Please print your name, your Student ID# and have your parent signature. You will turn in the form for a sticker to be placed on your CURRENT School ID Card, at snack or lunch ONLY in Room 1110.

On the day your GRADE is going off campus, you can ONLY turn your form in at SNACK ONLY!

DO NOT REMOVE the sticker it's good for the whole school year. If you lose the stickers, you will need to fill out another form.
