GUSD Named to Educational Results Partnership Honor Roll

Glendale, CA – Glendale Unified School District and 18 GUSD schools have been named to the 2017-18 Educational Results Partnership Honor Roll for high achievement and student success. The Honor Roll program, sponsored by the Campaign for Business and Education Excellence (CBEE), is part of a national effort to identify high performing schools and districts that are improving student outcomes.

This is the third year ERP has recognized Honor Roll School Districts and GUSD has been recognized every year. It is one of only nine public school districts in California to receive this honor for three consecutive years. Additionally, 11 GUSD schools have been named 2017-18 “Star Schools,” high performing schools serving higher poverty communities: Clark Magnet HS, Glendale HS, Hoover HS, Toll MS, Wilson MS, Glenoaks ES, Mann ES, Muir ES, Keppel ES, Jefferson ES, and R.D. White ES. Seven more GUSD schools have been recognized as “Scholar Schools,” high performing schools without significant levels of low-income students: Crescenta Valley HS, Rosemont HS, Fremont ES, Monte Vista ES, Mountain Avenue ES, Valley View ES, and Verdugo Academy independent study program.

The 2017-18 Honor Roll is developed by Educational Results Partnership (ERP), a nonprofit organization that applies data science to help improve student outcomes and college and career readiness. ERP maintains the nation’s largest database on student achievement and utilizes this data to identify higher-performing schools and districts. School districts that receive the ERP Honor Roll distinction have demonstrated consistent high levels of student academic achievement and college readiness, improvement in achievement levels over time, and a reduction in achievement gaps among student populations.

“We are proud to be recognized as an ERP Honor Roll School District by educational and business leaders in California,” said GUSD Superintendent Winfred B. Roberson, Jr. “Our teachers, administrators, and classified staff are committed to maximizing student achievement and continuously improving our practices. We are pleased to see our hard work and dedication translating to positive outcomes for all our students.”

“Educational success must be data-informed,” said ERP and CBEE Board Chair Greg Jones. “These Honor Roll schools and districts are improving student achievement and we have the data to prove it. It’s critical
